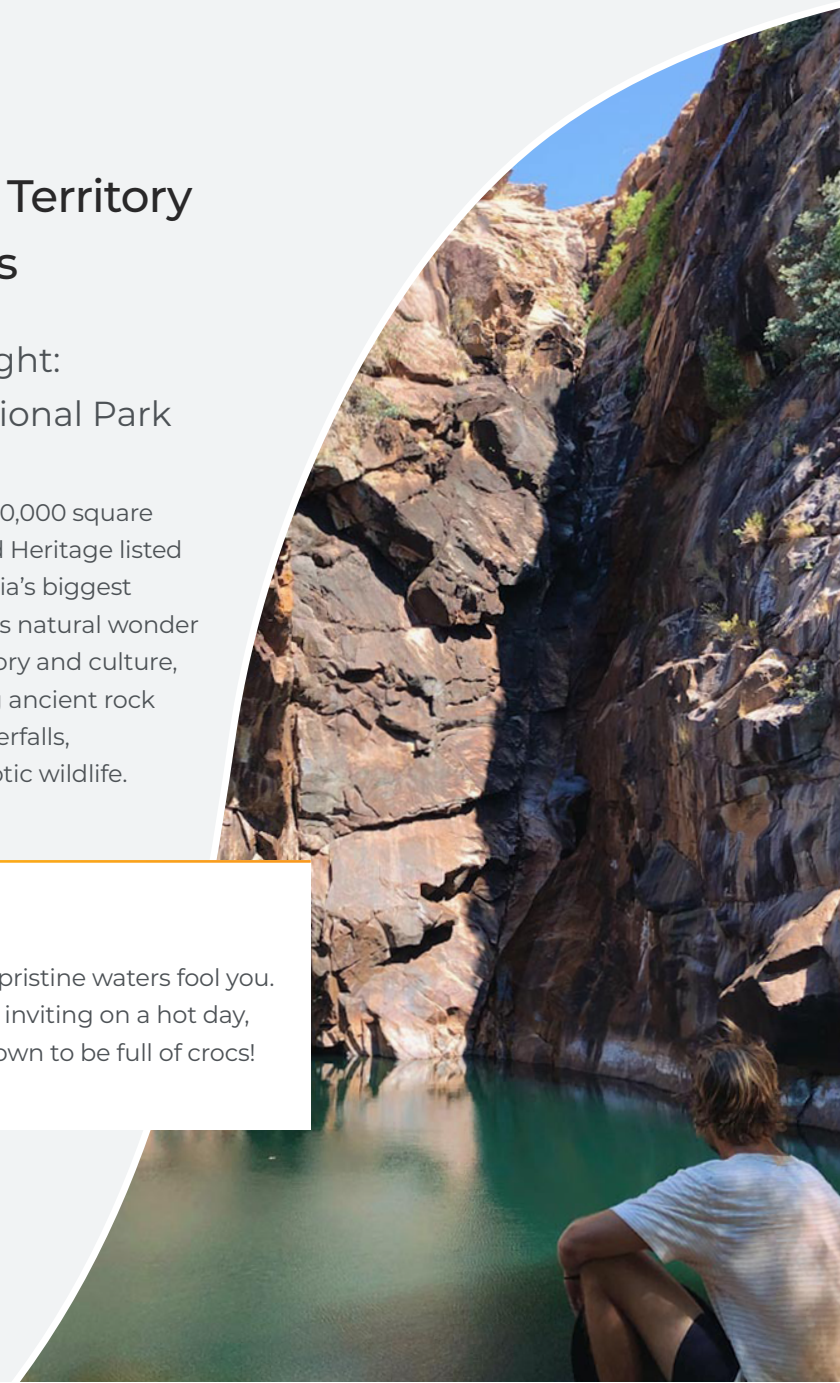
## Northern Territory highlights

Favourite sight:  
Kakadu National Park

Covering nearly 20,000 square kilometres, World Heritage listed Kakadu is Australia's biggest national park. This natural wonder is steeped in history and culture, offering stunning ancient rock art as well as waterfalls, wetlands and exotic wildlife.

### **INSIDER TIP:**

Do not let the pristine waters fool you. They may look inviting on a hot day, but they're known to be full of crocs!





## Victoria highlights

Favourite sight:  
Great Ocean Road and the 12 Apostles

Situated along one of Australia's most scenic routes, the 12 Apostles are truly awe-inspiring and an absolute must-do for Aussies and visitors alike.

**INSIDER TIP:**

If you have time, stay a couple nights in Port Fairy, a heritage township lined with Norfolk pines and full of wildlife walks, swimming spots and no shortage of pubs!

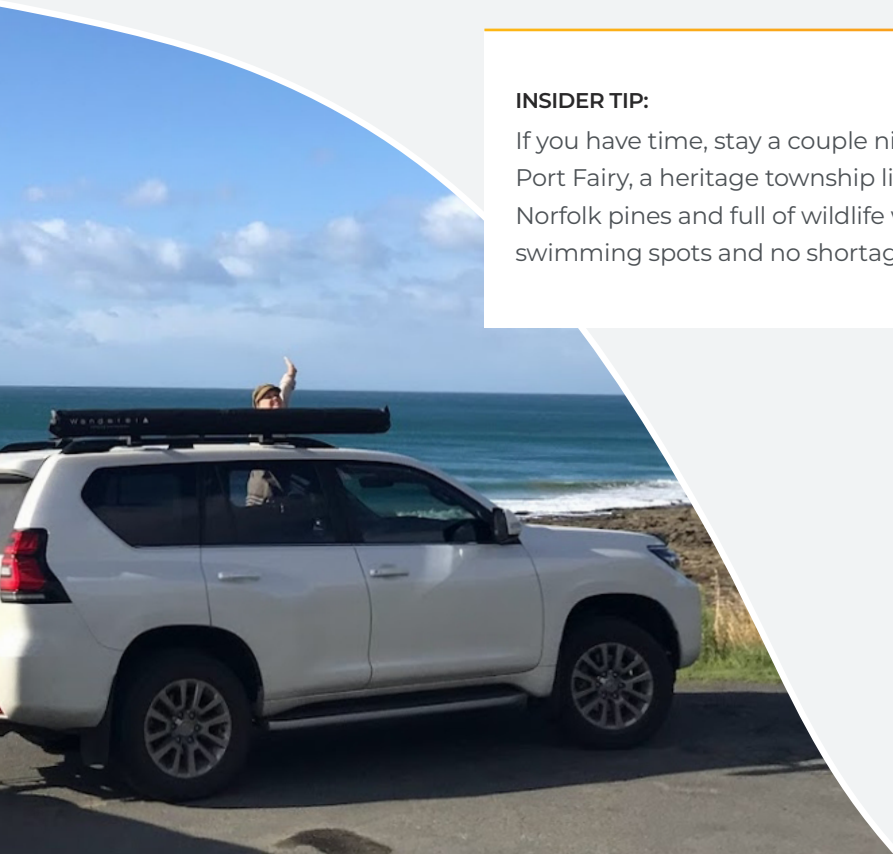
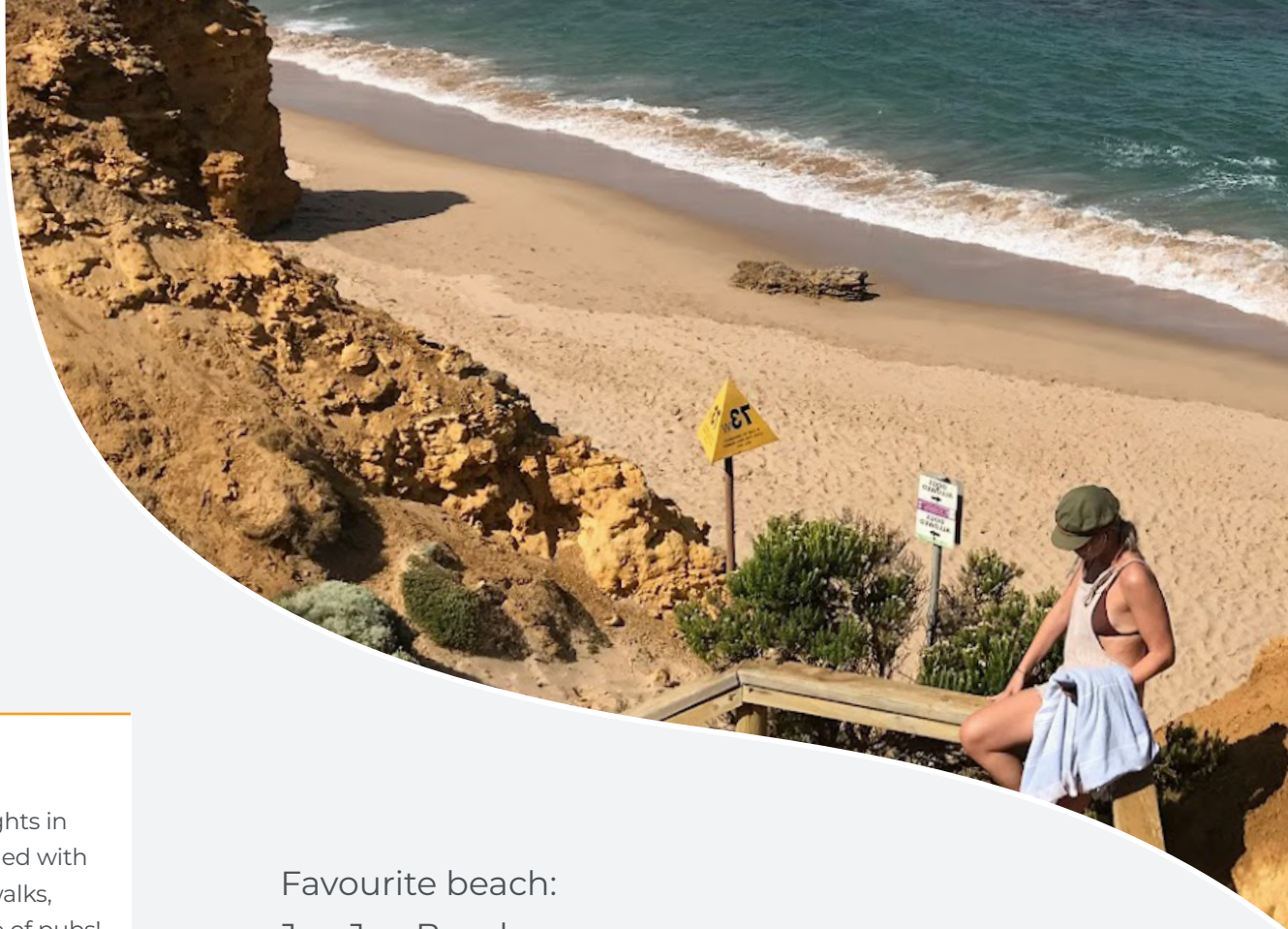
Favourite beach:  
Jan Juc Beach

A must-stop spot on the Great Ocean Road, Jan Juc is located just south of Torquay, about 80km from Melbourne.

**WHY BRYCE LOVES IT:**

"Whether you're surfing, swimming or walking along the sand, this beach offers some spectacular cliffs and rock formations carved from the winds of the Southern Ocean and the Bass Strait."





## South Australia highlights

### Favourite sight: Talia Beach and Caves

South Australia's raw, rugged coastline is one of its most spectacular attractions. Spread along the Eyre Peninsula, Talia Beach is famed for its rock fishing, while the caves carved into the granite cliff are just waiting to be discovered.

### Favourite beach: Goolwa Beach

The historic meeting point of the Murray River and the Indian Ocean is located an hour's south of Adelaide.

#### WHY BRYCE LOVES IT:

"It has amazing sunsets and snow-white sand, and we got to enjoy some beach four-wheel-driving. A very relaxing place."





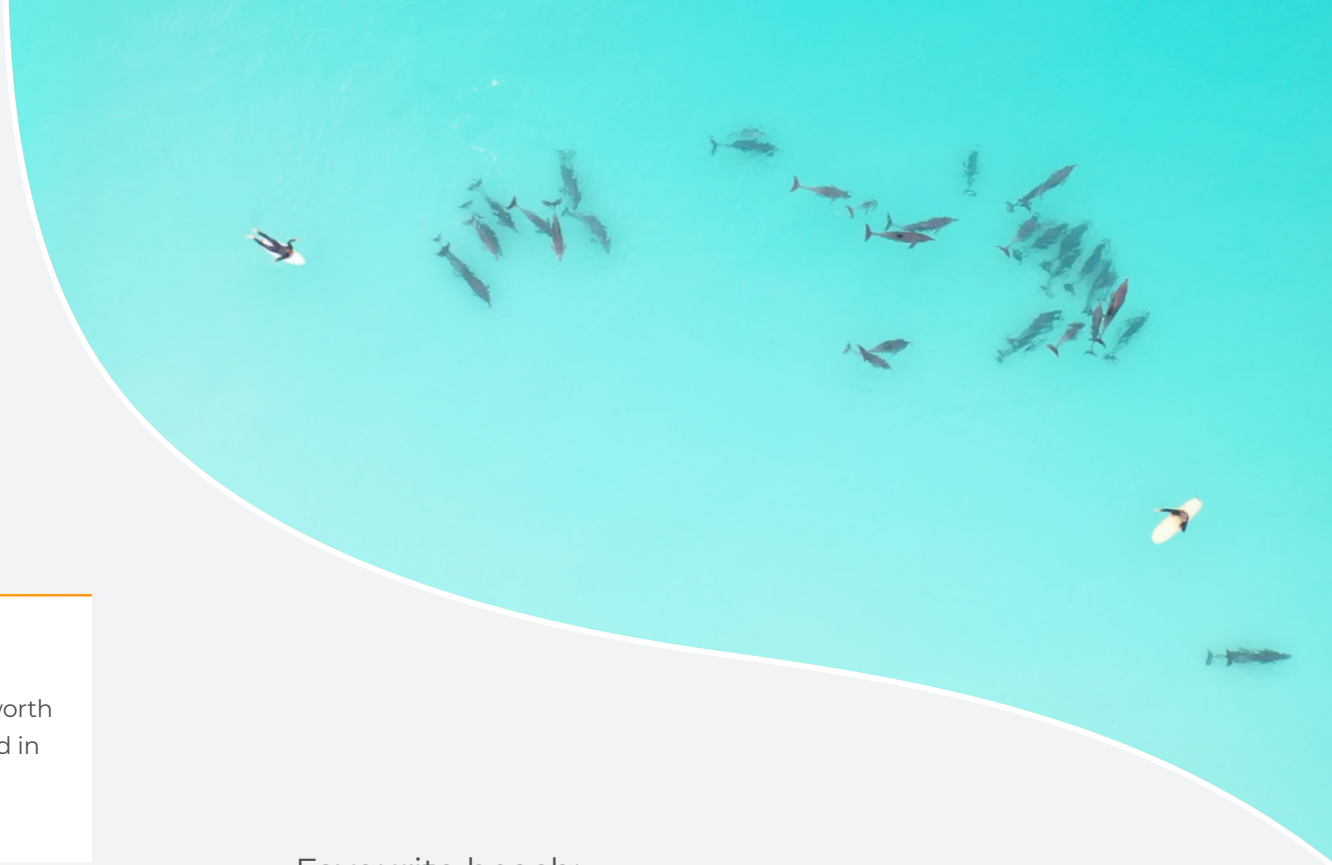
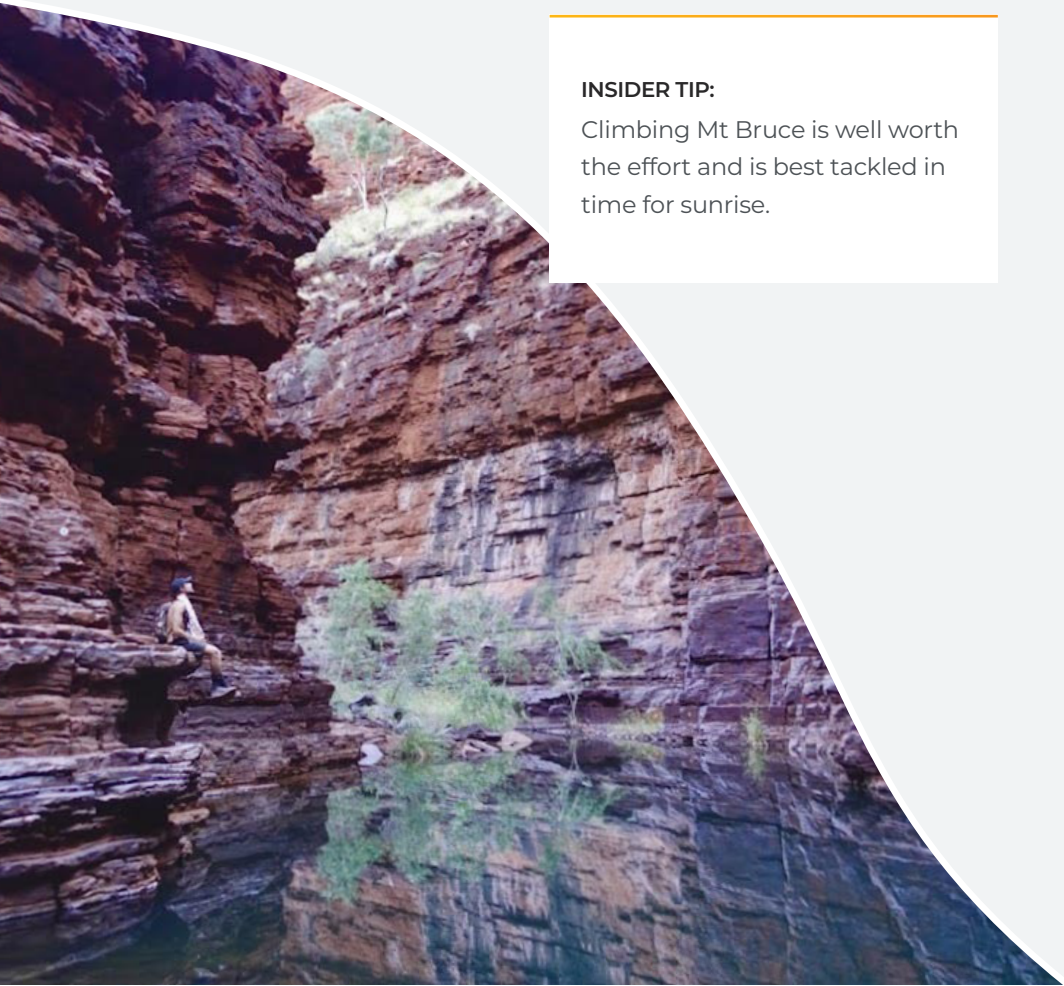
# Western Australia highlights

## Favourite sight: Karijini National Park

The photos do not do justice to the vibrant colours on display here. It's an adventurer's wonderland with many amazing watering holes, hikes and enormous natural gorges to explore.

### INSIDER TIP:

Climbing Mt Bruce is well worth the effort and is best tackled in time for sunrise.



## Favourite beach: Wharton Beach

Located on the Duke of Orleans Bay, and within Cape Le Grand National Park, Wharton Beach is famous for its peaceful and tranquil vibes with sand so fine it squeaks!

### WHY BRYCE LOVES IT:

"It has some of the clearest water I've ever seen! Liz and I jumped on our boards and were delighted to be joined by over 40 dolphins – a longheld dream of ours."



## Queensland highlights

### Favourite sight: Glass House Mountains

Located in the South East, this fabled mountain range consists of 11 jaw-dropping molten lava volcanic peaks.

#### **INSIDER TIP:**

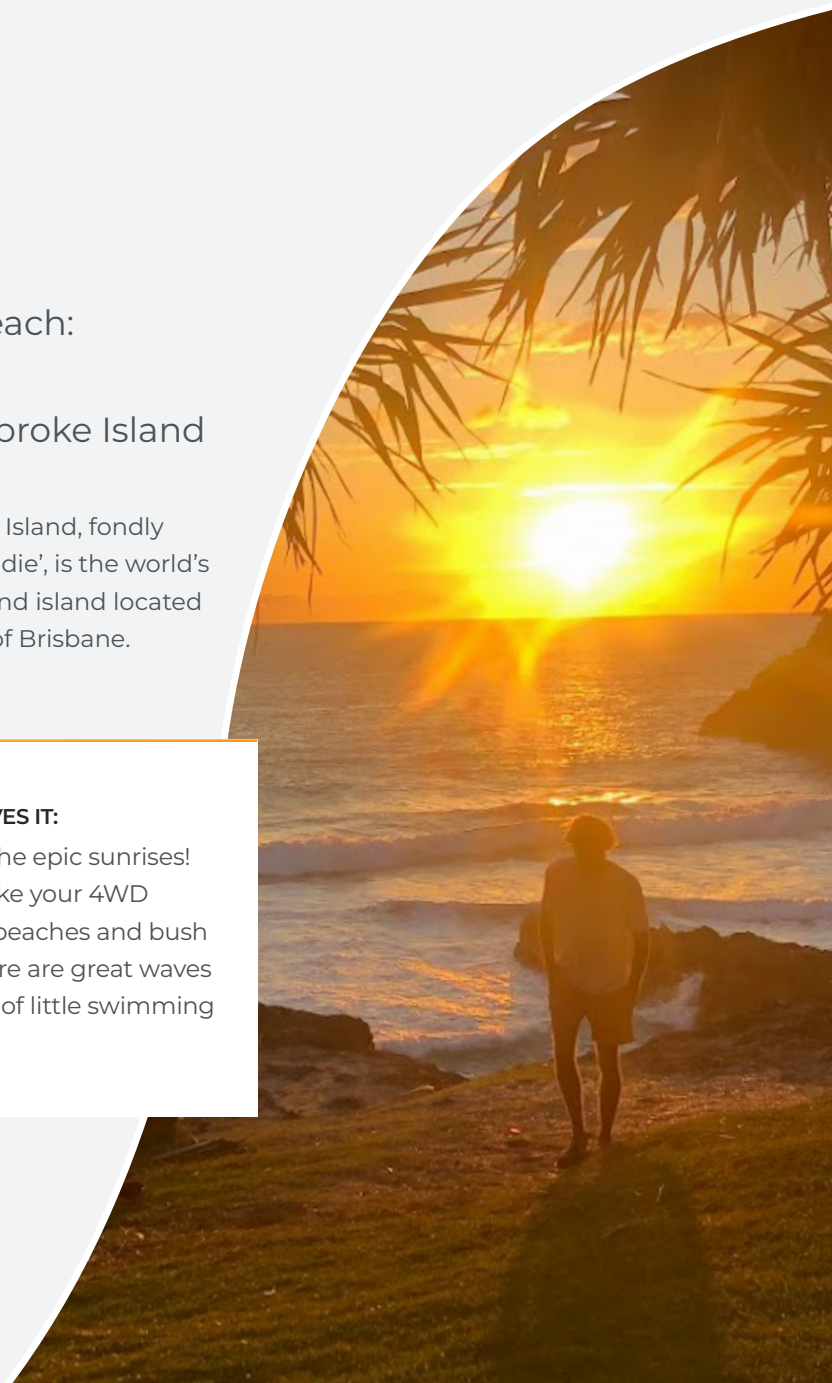
If you're up for the 2-hour hike, the peak of Mount Ngungun boasts stunning 360-degree views of the surrounding alpine region.

### Favourite beach: Main Beach, North Stradbroke Island


North Stradbroke Island, fondly nicknamed 'Straddie', is the world's second largest sand island located 30km southeast of Brisbane.

#### **WHY BRYCE LOVES IT:**

"To start with, the epic sunrises! You can also take your 4WD vehicle on the beaches and bush tracks, plus there are great waves to surf and lots of little swimming coves to enjoy."








## New South Wales highlights

### Favourite sight: Jenolan Caves

South of the Blue Mountains National Park, the Jenolan Caves house ancient limestone formations created by underground rivers.



### Favourite beach: Crescent Head

This small laidback town at the southern edge of the Macleay Valley is home to one of the most popular surfing spots in the country.

#### WHY BRYCE LOVES IT:

“There’s a golf course right on the headland, plus some great camping spots nearby. Queens Head is perfect for some four-wheel driving.”



## Bryce's top tips for travelling with pets

**TIP #2:**

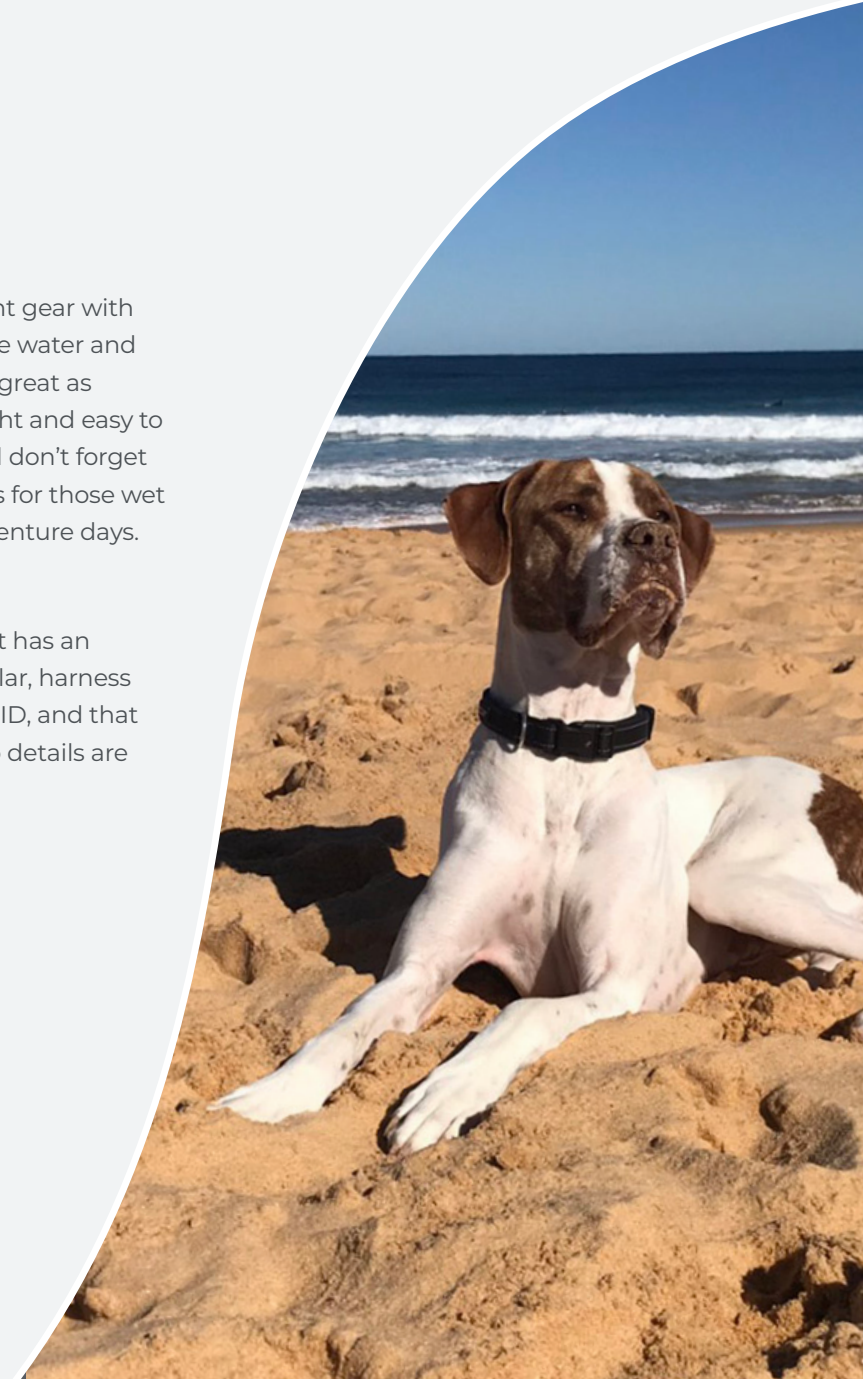
Is your dog's nature well suited to travel? We're lucky that Bronson is gentle around children, doesn't bark, loves cuddling and gets along with other dogs.

**TIP #4:**

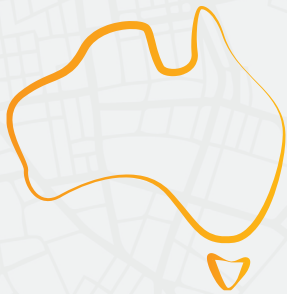
Ensure your pet has an appropriate collar, harness including clear ID, and that their microchip details are up-to-date.
